



#### Maintaining PRIDE Amidst the Storm: A Restorative Healing Circle

Even with decades of hard-fought gains, members of the LGBTQ+ community continue to find various aspects of who they are and how they show up under attack. This impacts the body, mind, spirit, and how one shows up at all levels of their lives. For these reasons, this circle practice is designed to provide a safe space for participants to gather, get to know one another on a human-to-human level through sharing their experiences, learning strategies to increase wellness and well-being. When we can connect, build relational belonging, and implement practical everyday wellness skills, we increase resilience and decrease stress and anxiety.

#### Restorative Healing Circle Structure: (Total Time 90 minutes)--Zoom

Ideally groups would range from 15 - 20 people

- Members will gather together and check-in (10 minutes)
- Begin with a grounding or centering activity (10 minutes)
- Learn about research/information about stress and/or trauma and 1 2 practical skills or strategies (30 minutes)\*
- Circle Share Time—can be structured (the four questions) and unstructured (30 minutes)
- Wrap up and Debrief (10 minutes)

\*Can be substituted with an exploration of creative works (art, poetry, music, etc.)

#### About Dr. Valerie Nyberg:

Dr. Valerie Nyberg was raised here in Sacramento. She recently moved back after spending 12 years in the Pacific Northwest and 18 years in Iowa where she raised her sons. She is a former high school teacher and high school associate principal and principal. In 2017, she became a trained restorative practitioner. Recently Dr. Nyberg has earned her certification as a IIRP Restorative Practice Trainer. Though not a mental health professional or psychologist, Dr. Nyberg has extensively studied and has experiences with implementing trauma-informed practices. As a survivor of childhood complex trauma and military service-connected PTSD, she wants to help others leverage their experiences for their personal growth and wellbeing. Dr. Nyberg earned her PhD in Teaching and Learning from the University of Iowa in 2012.


